Course Description

The focus of this year-long course is to study the Algebra 2 text. The material covered this year includes a mixture of advanced Algebra 1 and Algebra 2 topics such as

- Equations
- Systems of equations
- Absolute value
- Distance/rate and time
- Linear graphs and functions
- Factoring quadratics
- Quadratic graphs and functions
- Completing the square
- Quadratic formula to solve equations
- Logarithms

Expectations

- ❖ All homework/quizzes/tests MUST be done in PENCIL. Notes may be taken in pencil or INK!
- Bring your math textbook to class EVERY DAY.
- ❖ Bring your math binder EVERY DAY for taking notes.
- There should be no talking, note passing or goofing around during lessons. Focus on the instructor.
- Always look like you are having fun and feel free to laugh at the teacher's jokes!

Materials

Students are responsible for bringing the following materials to class **EVERY DAY**:

- Text book
- Pencils- mechanical pencils are highly preferred. Sharpening pencils in class will be limited.
- ➤ Binder with loose leaf or graph paper (used for notes and classwork).
- > Graph paper (used for homework); You may choose to use a notebook to keep homework in one place.

Absence/Tardiness

- o Regular attendance is obviously extremely important. I cannot re-teach lessons that you missed.
- When a student is absent they will have <u>one</u> day for every day absent to make up the work. It is the STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY to make up all homework, notes, quizzes, or tests that are missed!
 (I will NOT remind students to turn in missed homework. If you are sick please check the blog for the assignment.) If you are out sick for over 3 days or more, see me for a homework progress plan.
- Students who are not in their seats when the bell rings (except by teacher authorization) are tardy.
- 3 tardies = 1 detention

Homework

- Homework will be assigned almost every night including Fridays. Each assignment is worth 10 points.
- Homework is due at the beginning of the class period from the prior school day.
- It is YOUR responsibility to check your answers ahead of time and come to class with very specific questions. I will do my best to provide any answers not in the back of the textbook.
- Homework problems are to be <u>copied</u> out of the book and written onto <u>graph paper</u>. There will occasionally be time allotted in class to do homework and it is <u>MANDATORY</u> to do this work while in class. You may not talk "socially" in class instead of doing your homework. (Academic collaboration is welcome!)
- Leave all homework assignments in your graph paper notebook. There is no need to remove individual pages. You may turn in your entire notebook when I check review assignments on test days.

Grading Policy

- ✓ Tests, quizzes, and homework assignments are graded on a standard 100% scale.
- ✓ Work completed in INK will receive half credit. (This does not apply to note taking.)
- ✓ Homework will receive full credit if each problem *is attempted* and *all work is shown* on the paper.
- ✓ Partially completed homework will receive a partial score.
- ✓ Your math journal is a large portion of your participation grade. Always take notes.
- ✓ **Cheating/plagiarizing** is obviously **forbidden** and will be addressed with the Dean of Students.
